### May 27, 2020 Board of Governor's Meeting

- **President's Report:** Thank you to Tucker Mostrom for the very successful new member walk! Also, thank you to everyone involved in re-opening the ranges.
- **Item For Discussion:** We discussed changing the bylaws to allow for electronic notices of meetings with appropriate notice, as well as electronic signatures.
- Arthur Belendiuk is working with the GW and Georgetown Universities; someone removed the tape studying the trees. They also have cicada traps that should not be touched!
- Archery and R&P are open with restrictions.
- No National Convention this year, Maryland isn't eligible to host again until 2023.

### NEW BUSINESS

- Motion to accept new members. – Motion passes unanimously.
- Motion to request modest contribution (\$2) from non-members using the target range. – Motion passes unanimously.

Meeting adjourned at 8:37pm.

### June 17, 2020 Membership Meeting

- **President's Report:** Despite the closure a lot of things have been going forward behind the scenes. Thank you to Carol Efdimis and the range chairs! We are going to discuss potentially re-opening the chapter house.
- We established that we had a quorum and the Past President introduced the 2020 – 2021 slate of officers. The membership unanimously voted for the slate.
- **Farm Committee:** Farm is looking beautiful! We've been trimming the field edges. Want to thank Mike Noble and the Lamkins for their help mowing. B3 field has some slug damage; we lost 35% of the sunflowers due to a mixture of wet conditions and our low-impact planting. Electric fence is holding the deer back. Planted another nine acres of sunflower field, but the deer ate it. There is also a fox-tail millet issue. Took apart the planter and fixing it, looks like something we can handle in-house.
- **Wildlife Committee:** One turkey taken on the farm. NestWatch looks good. Snake defenses look adequate this year.
- Christmas trees are looking good. From August on you can shape and tag trees.
- **Ponds & Streams Committee:** Algae bloom came from upstream. See article in newsletter.
- **Trails Committee:** Cleared in the West Woods so that the bush hog can reach grassy areas. Nature trail is also cleared, and North Woods are next.
- **Log Cabin Committee:** Some progress on the Spring House, the water is flowing again. See article in newsletter.
- **Archery Committee:** Record numbers of use for the 3D course! We have beginner bows, and it's fun for the whole family.
- **R&P Range Committee:** Big thanks to the RO's. We are now comfortable with members bringing one guest, even if it isn't from the household.

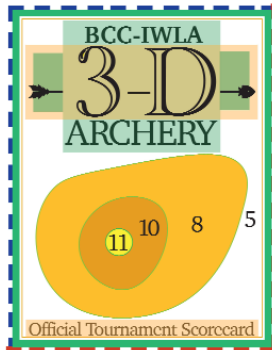
The range is open to all members, and it can be used in the absence of Range Officers, but if you have not used the range before, please contact me via email before your first visit, so we can go over safe use practices.

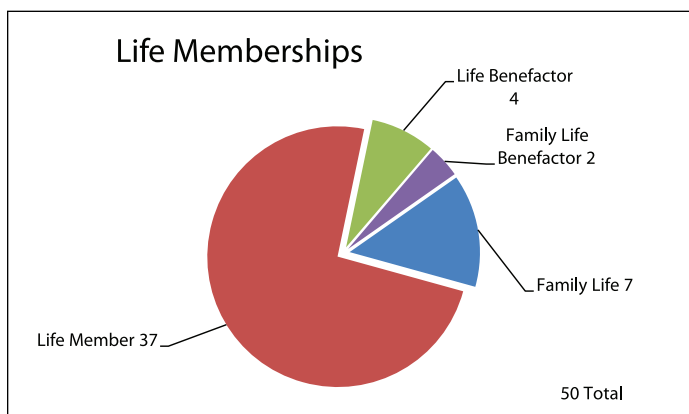
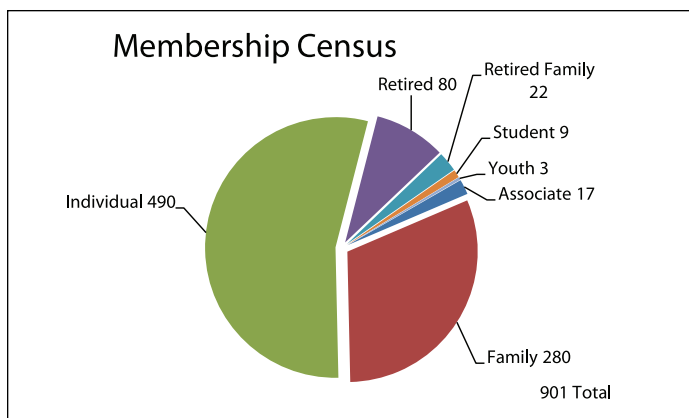

## Chapterhouse Exterior Cleanups

The Chapterhouse Committee has scheduled a cleanup of the chapterhouse exterior and grounds for Saturday, July 25th, 10:00am to 2:00pm. This will count as a chapterhouse cleanup rain or shine for any new or prospective members who need to fulfill that requirement.

## B-CC IWLA SUMMER BIATHLON PROGRAM 2020 PRACTICE SCHEDULE

**MISSION:** To provide a venue for novice through world-class summer biathletes to learn and/or refine the skills inherent to the sport.

**To provide** a vehicle to introduce athletes of other sports to the shooting sports and consequently an understanding of firearms and the Second Amendment (B-CC IWLA members please recruit, in particular, middle school, high school, and collegiate athletes – freedom/liberty is never more than one generation away from extinction).

**ELIGIBILITY:** Summer Biathlon is open to all B-CC IWLA members 12 years and older, as well as, sponsored guests. B-CC IWLA members no range fee. **Non-member rate is \$5.00 per session.**

**EVENT:** Running distances at B-CC IWLA are set at 5 kilometers (3.1 miles) split into 5 loops or 3 – one-mile loops. Currently, a single course at each length has been laid out. A short course for those working up to the other distances has been laid out as well. The regulation shooting distance is 50 meters, however, targets are also set at 25 meters for development of the shooting art. There are four shooting stops on the 5km course and two stops on the 3-mile course. Shooting stops alternate between prone (lying down) and off-hand (standing) positions. Five rounds are fired at each stop for a total of 20 shots on the 5km course and 10 shots on the 3-mile course. An equal number of shots are fired from each shooting position.

**SCORING:** Scoring is based on a time to complete basis. A penalty of either one (1) minute or a 50-100 meter penalty lap will be assessed for each shot missed.

**EQUIPMENT:** .22 caliber biathlon rifles are the standard; however, any magazine fed, .22 caliber rifle with either bolt or lever action is permitted. **Only standard velocity .22 caliber target ammunition is allowed.**

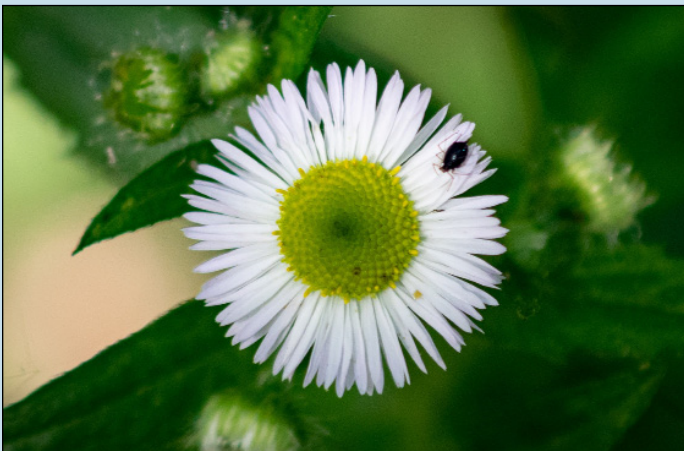

## Spring is Sprung: a long and pleasant spring on the Conservation Farm

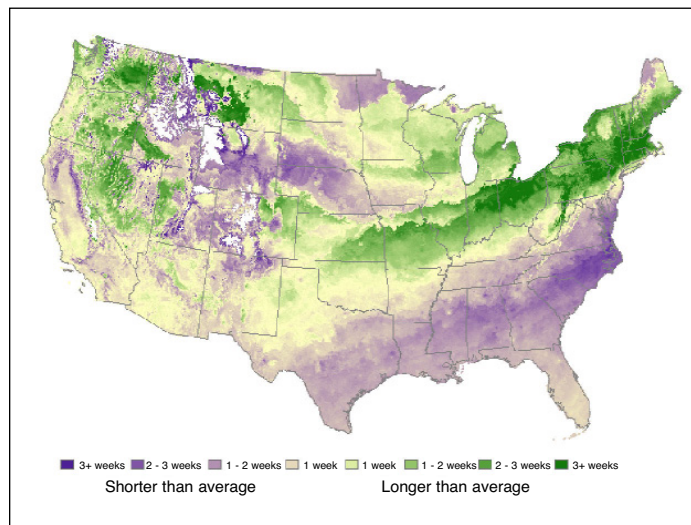

About 6:00pm on Saturday, June 20th our calendars recorded the arrival of the Summer Solstice. Springtime was officially over. Lin remarked one day in mid-June that it had been a comfortably long and pleasant springtime. Turns out that it was quite unusual.

We know this as a result of analysis of citizen science data submitted to the USA National Phenology Network (<https://www.usanpn.org/>) an organization focused on tracking and sharing information on the timing of seasonal biological events such as leaf-out and flowering through an all-volunteer network.

For example, in our area, the data showed leaf-out of deciduous trees started earlier than usual and was ongoing for nearly two months longer than usual. At the same time, arrival of other signs of spring such as flowering was shorter than average.

Spring leaf-out arrived across much of the country 3-4 weeks earlier than the long-term average (1981-2010) in parts of the West, Southeast, and Northeast and up to 3 weeks late in parts of the northern Great Plains, upper Midwest, and upper Northeast.



Spring bloom flowering arrived across much of the country and followed a similar pattern of earlier spring bloom across the Southeast and later spring bloom in the northern Great Plains, Midwest, and parts of the Northeast.

In parts of the Southeast and Northwest, this year's spring leaf-out was the earliest in the 39-year record. In parts of Nevada, Wyoming, and Montana, this year's spring leaf-out was the latest on record.

In parts of the Midwest and Northeast, this year's spring bloom was the latest on record.

Or as Bob Dylan said:

*Come senators, congressmen / Please heed the call  
Don't stand in the doorway / Don't block up the hall  
For he that gets hurt / Will be he who has stalled  
The battle outside ragin' / Will soon shake your windows  
And rattle your walls...*

*For the times they are a-changin'*

## NestWatch Report

Oh, those remarkable Purple Martins! June was a very productive month for our martins. Thirty-nine breeding pairs produced 155 nestlings growing and expected to fledge in July and about 10 eggs due to hatch in July and fledge in August. The normal clutch is four-to-six eggs, but our pairs produced one clutch of 7 eggs and one of 8 eggs. The average incubation period is 16 days, and martins typically fledge 28 to 32 days after hatching.

It has been a productive breeding season for the Tree Swallows as well; 35 swallows fledged in June from seven nests, and a few more nestlings will mature and fledge in July.

Our Eastern Bluebird nesting pairs are working on second and third nesting attempts; three pairs are rearing nine nestlings which will fledge in July; one of the three is a third nesting attempt. Three additional bluebird nests boast a dozen eggs, which will hatch and fledge in July.

We heartily welcomed Brett Davis to our team this month. He arrived just in time to help with our challenging Purple Martin monitoring. A number of Brett's photographs are included with this report.

As always, our team would be happy to include you in a nestbox check. If interested, please email me.

Many thanks to Peter Cappellino and his daughter Amelia, who photographed many of our martin nestlings this month. Thanks also to Theresa Zmola, who has contributed so much of her time and talent to the NestWatch project, and to her son Ethan, whose assistance this season has been so appreciated.

## Big Pond (Walton) Algae Problem

On Sunday, June 14, 2020, Larry Anderson reported to John Novak that the big pond surface had a scum/algae accumulation (see photo 1). A trip to the big pond on Monday morning (6/15/20) revealed that the scum/algae was still there. The source of this accumulation, while unknown, came

into the big pond via the inflowing stream at the uppermost end. This small stream that flows through private property was observed to be choked with algae where it enters the big pond (see photo 2). John Novak reported the incident to the Maryland Department of the Environment (MD DEP), and contacted Boggs Environmental Consultants, Inc. (Boggs) located in Middletown, MD who agreed to come out to the chapter to inspect the big pond on Friday morning (6/19). Pete Wirth, Bryan Kurtz, and John Novak met with Boggs, and upon arriving at the big pond, it was observed that the scum had disappeared, but algae was still present on the surface (see photo 3). The solar-powered

aerators were operating (see photo 4) which may have contributed to the scum disappearance. After Boggs' visit, we asked them to provide a contract to investigate the algae issue to include algae identification, nutrient analysis, dissolved oxygen, pH, any remedial measures, and cost. We also contacted Solitude Lake Management about investigating the algae issue. We have received a contract from both firms and are now reviewing them. Also, on Friday morning, Chris Luckett, biologist with MD DEP, met with John Novak down at the big pond. Mr. Luckett walked around the pond and noted concentrations of algae, likely blue

green, dispersed on the surface of the pond including the cove above the solar panel. Mr. Luckett analyzed a sample which showed high concentrations of three blue-green algae species which produce toxins. A preliminary report was provided to John Novak. MD DEP then conducted an analysis of these blue-green algae for the toxin, microcystin. Results of the toxin analysis provided to John Novak revealed a microcystin concentration of 115 parts per billion (ppb) which is well above MD DEP's standard of 8 ppb for a contact advisory. Monitoring of the big pond for blue-green algae will continue with a proposed re-testing by MD DEP in about two weeks.

Contact with the big pond water should be avoided until re-testing for the toxins is completed and the water is deemed safe. However, should someone come in contact with big pond water, thorough hand washing is recommended. Further, dogs should be kept out of the water, as blue-green algae can be deadly for dogs. We will keep the chapter membership updated on the big pond algae situation.

### B-CC Quiz Answer:

**Phenology** is the study of periodic plant and animal life cycle events and how these are influenced by seasonal and year-to-year variations in climate. Springtime was officially over and the **Phenologists** were tabulating their citizen science data.
