NOTICE TO ALL MEMBERS:

On Sunday, December 8, someone cut the cable supporting the gate to the Archery Range, removed the gate from its hinges, and gained access to our property. There was no other apparent damage.

A white work truck with the tailgate down with PVC pipes and other construction materials in the bed was seen on the property near the pump house and Archery sheds. If anyone has any information about this truck or its occupant(s), please contact the Archery chairs.

This event also reminds us that we all have a hand in looking out for our fellow members, the Chapter, and its assets. As you all know, you must have your membership card with you at all times while on the property and present it upon request. You are also expected to have your current, numbered IWLA decal visible in your car window.

Your card and decal allow others to know that you have a right to be on the property. Also, in the event that your vehicle is found at a time that suggests you may need assistance, we can know who we're looking for and take steps to help more quickly. If you hunt on the property and are likely to be in remote locations, this is particularly important for you.

Your part in all of this starts with making sure your contact information is up to date and you always have a current sticker in the window of your car.

On the other side of this, if a serious situation arises, the first step is to identify who may be at risk. That means you check the sticker number and pass it on to the President, the first VP, and the second VP. Someone will then reach out to the mobile contact info on file and, if necessary, to the emergency contact. If it's life-threatening, obviously call 9-11 immediately.

If you see something that just looks out of place or suspicious, then reach out to the appropriate committee chair. Again, check for a sticker, take a moment to snap pictures of vehicles and license plates. Be proactive. We all need to be aware even as we're out on our beautiful farm taking a break getting a breath of fresh air.

Summary of the November 2024 Board of Governors Meeting and the December 2024 Membership Dinner Meeting

Wednesday, November 18, 2024 – Board of Governors Meeting

- Walter Robison made a request to use the Chapter House including the members kitchen for Professional Grounds Management Society annual meeting on January 9, 2025. Motion made and approved.
- NAVHDA requested to use the Chapter House and members kitchen for their Annual Meeting on February 23 from 12:00 noon to 5:00pm. **Motion made and approved.**
- Seneca Pony Club requested to use the Chapter House for their annual Christmas Party on December 20. Motion made and approved.
- President Andy Wight discussed the need to update the By-Laws to reflect current chapter practices including to allow prospective members to attend two well-defined chapter events in lieu of regular meetings. The third meeting would need to be a dinner meeting.
- Talked about clear expectations for probationary members including committee involvement.
- President Wight proposed adding a job description for committee chairs, including responsibilities for easement compliance and community involvement.
- Discussed consideration to update wording in Article VI Section 1 to allow the President flexibility in the timing of appointing an election committee.

TARGET RANGE

The Range is open during sunlight hours every day, all year long.

Guests must sign a Hold Harmless Form and deposit it in the range box along with optional contribution.

Broadhead use on designated gel medium targets only, please.

YOUTH ARCHERY

We will likely have spring and summer sessions this year.

3-D ARCHERY

The course is closed until next spring.

Interpretive Walk in the Woods

Our Annual Interpretive Walk in the Woods will take place between Wednesday the 19th and Friday the 21st of February. The walk in woods is part of our Conservation Education program together with Poolesville High School. Students will walk from River Road back through the West Woods and back to the Chapter.

Note – on these three days, hunting will be suspended (it's rabbit and squirrel season) across the chapter.

B-CC IWLA Summer Biathlon Program 2025 Practice Schedule

MISSION: To provide a venue for novice through world class summer biathletes to learn and/or refine the skills inherent to the sport.

To provide a vehicle to introduce athletes of other sports to the shooting sports and consequently an understanding of firearms and the Second Amendment (B-CC IWLA members please recruit, in particular, middle school, high school, and collegiate athletes – freedom/liberty is never more than one generation away from extinction).

ELIGIBILITY: Summer Biathlon is open to all B-CC IWLA members 12 years and older, as well as sponsored guests. B-CC IWLA members no range fee. **Non-member rate is \$5.00 per session.**

EVENT: Running distances at B-CC IWLA are set at 5 kilometers (3.1 miles) split into 5 loops or 3 – one mile loops. Currently, a single course at each length has been laid out. A short course for those working up to the other distances has been laid out as well. The regulation shooting distance is 50 meters, however, targets are also set at 25 meters for development of the shooting art. There are four shooting stops on the 5km course and two stops on the 3 mile course. Shooting stops alternate between prone (lying down) and off-hand (standing) positions. Five rounds are fired at each stop for a total of 20 shots on the 5km course and 10 shots on the 3 mile course. An equal number of shots are fired from each shooting position.

SCORING: Scoring is based on a time to complete basis. A penalty of either one (1) minute or a 50-100 meter penalty lap will be assessed for each shot missed.

EQUIPMENT: .22 caliber biathlon rifles are the standard; however, any magazine fed, .22 caliber rifle with either bolt or lever action is permitted. **Only standard velocity** .22 caliber target ammunition is allowed.

The Great Backyard Bird Count is an inter-organizational effort between the **Cornell Lab of Ornithology**, **National Audubon Society**, **and Birds Canada**. They work together to bring the joys of birdwatching to our members.

Participate in the Great Backyard Bird Count. Spend at least 15 minutes a day, on at least one of the four count days, observing and counting the birds in your back yard, local park, or wherever you spot a bird, and submit your observations online. Go to **www.birdcount.org** to learn how to participate using your smart phone and the Merlin or Audubon app., or your computer.

Have you noticed robins, chickadees, starlings, woodpeckers or cardinals in your yard or neighborhood? Here is an opportunity to count them all for science. The annual count helps scientists assess species populations.


Saturday, February 22, 2025 6:00pm – 10:00pm

FeederWatch News

The overwintering birds are here, and our 14th FeederWatch season is underway! Counting birds is both enjoyable and educational. Please consider joining other chapter members who count species and numbers of birds observed within species on weekends from early November through late March.

Our data is reported to Cornell University's Lab of Ornithology, along with data submitted from thousands of other participants across the country. Our data helps Cornell scientists analyze shifts in bird species and numbers within species in the United States and Canada. Next Spring the Cornell Lab will publish results by geographic area. Maryland falls in the Lab's southeast region.

We welcome and seek new participants. Please email me if you can help. I will send you our tally sheet and instructions. Count birds for at least an hour on two successive days, or on one day if you are pressed for time, from the comfort of the chapter house.
